Dear Dr. Kornegay:

At its meeting on June 10, 2022, the North Carolina Board of Licensed Clinical Mental Health Counselors (the "Board") carefully reviewed the Board's records and your communications with the Board regarding your compliance with the Consent Order entered on January 28, 2022 in the matter of *Donna M. Chandler Kornegay, LCMHCS, Case No. 1766*. A copy of the Consent Order is enclosed.

Pursuant to Paragraph XVIII of the Consent Order, the Board, in its discretion, voted to REVOKE your license as Licensed Clinical Mental Health Counselor Supervisor <u>effective July 6, 2022</u>.

In accordance with the Board's decision, you are ordered to do the following:

- 1. No later than July 6, 2022, you shall cease to engage in any activities that meet the definition of the practice of counseling as provided in N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-330(a)(3), including supervision, or fall under the prohibitions set forth in N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-331.
- 2. You shall turn in your license to practice counseling in North Carolina to the Board no later than July 8, 2022. In the event you are unable to find your license to practice counseling in North Carolina, you shall submit an Affidavit to the Board stating that despite your diligent search, you have been unable to locate your original license and that in the event you find it in the future, you will promptly turn it to the Board. You shall mail your original license or an Affidavit to:

No later than July 8, 2022, you shall provide a signed affidavit (a written statement made under oath or affirmation taken before a person having authority to administer such oath or affirmation) to the Board, attesting that you are no longer engaged in the practice of counseling as provided in N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-330(a)(3), including supervision, in any way.

Please note that if the Board finds that you are continuing to practice counseling, the Board will seek an injunction in Superior Court against you.

Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-340 (g), a person whose license has been revoked may reapply to the Board for licensure after one calendar year from the date of the denial. Please note that if you re-apply for licensure, you will have to comply with the requirements that are in effect on the date of receipt of your new application by the Board.
